


Understanding the CPT Process MS and PhD Students





Curricular Practical Training (CPT)

CPT is a type of work authorization for eligible F-1 international students to participate in paid off-campus internships. The purpose of CPT is academic, not just for employment and the internship must be considered an integral part of your degree program.



CPT Eligibility



Time at USC


- 2 academic semesters
- Attended other universities in the U.S.? You may be eligible sooner.

GPA

- Fall/Spring CPT: 3.0
- Summer CPT: 2.75




Things to Consider...

• Volunteering opportunities: This is allowed but should not receive any kind of compensation.


If the volunteer internship does not satisfy <u>DOL</u>rules regarding volunteer work, then the work is "employment." In this case, an international student can engage in the internship only if he/she/they has proper work authorization.

- Internship application process should be one semester prior
- During your first and second semester, some students find opportunities on-campus. You can get paid as a student worker.
- If you get an on-campus student worker position that is research based related to your major and you want to get ENGR course credit, contact the VASE office.



Planning Tips

- Work hard on your GPA from the first semester.
- During first 2 semesters, you should work on:
 - GPA
 - On-campus job opportunities
 - Campus engagement
 - Explore career options
- Learn and complete Career Success Pathway



Internship Requirements Hours of Employment

Fall or Spring Semester		
	Part-time OK (<20 hrs/week)	Full-time OK (21-40 hrs/week)
Final semester	YES	YES ≤4 credits + CPT credit
Not final-semester	YES (must enroll full time)	NO



*You are eligible to work both part-time or full-time during **summer**. *You cannot take academic difficulty RCL (Reduced Course Load) with internship simultaneously.


Things to Consider...

- Plan for Graduation Academic Plan Unit(s) in your final semester
- Consider your course load and whether a full-time or part-time internship is manageable.
- Check with a VASE advisor if you are sure about employment hours, academic load, etc.

Eligible for part-time	YES	NO




Admission and Student Engagement

Things to Consider:

- Relocation
- Remote internship
- Final semester final class
 - Work must be in the L.A area if your class enrollment is more than 4 credits.
- Full-time offer during final semester does not need end date





Things to Consider...

- Know whether internship credit can be applied to your degree
- Plan how many units of ENGR internship course You can't repeat ENGR 597 (0.5 units)
- Follow the course requirement for ENGR course



Internship Requirements Offer Letter

- Student's full name
- Job Location in the body of the letter
- Job description (not just title)
- Hours per week
- Beginning and ending dates of the internship


